FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

The themes of today’s readings are light and darkness, sight and blindness. These themes are also part of the Baptismal Rite. Throughout these readings, remember this well known phrase – “There are none so blind as those who will not see”. In the first reading from the first Book of Samuel, Samuel is directed by God to select the next king of Israel. He is to choose one of the sons of Jesse of Bethlehem, who had 8 sons. Of the 7 sons present, God rejected all of them. The youngest son, David, was then summoned from the fields and was selected by God. It is not by physical appearance that God judges but by what is in a person’s heart – “Not as man sees does God see”. God knew that David would be a good king because he looked into David’s heart and “the spirit of the Lord rushed upon David”. He was then anointed with oil (Messiah means anointed one) as the next king of Israel. To find out how this reading connects with the Gospel reading, see the expanded article at the St. Julie’s web site specified below. The Gospel reading from John is the Story of the Blind Man. Remember that the Hebrews believed that a man born with any physical impairment was either a sinner or paying for the sins of his father. Jesus makes a mud paste, spreads the paste on the blind man’s eyes. What Jesus did was, according to Jewish tradition, work, which was a violation of the Sabbath Law. He then tells him to wash in the pool of Siloam (meaning “one who is sent”). Note: In 2005, archaeologists found the pool of Siloam exactly where John said it was located. He washes in the water and his sight is restored. Here, as in last week’s reading, water symbolizes baptism, rebirth. Through the waters of baptism, we become the light of the world. Jesus performs this miracle on the Sabbath, where any work, however miniscule, is forbidden. The Pharisees, true to form, try to depict Jesus as a sinner because He does not keep the Sabbath. The blind man remains true to Jesus by telling the Pharisees that only a man of God could have cured him. At the end he becomes a follower of Jesus. The Pharisees never do see the Light (Jesus the Messiah), because they believed in the strict interpretation of the Law and not the spirit of the Law. Were they afraid to open their hearts and see the Light? To quote the late Bishop Ken Untener – “Our entire life is meant to be a process of opening our eyes, widening our vision. We are called to imitate the blind man, and not the Pharisees”.

**SAINT TURIBIUS OF MOGROVEJO (1538-1606)
— March 23**

In times of crisis, God always surprises the Church with unlikely saints, through whom Christ’s light radiates beyond their local communities to illumine the universal Church. Charles Borromeo was such a saint: appointed Archbishop of Milan at twenty-one by his papal uncle, epitomizing the corruption that the reformers condemned, Charles instead inspired a revival that reinvigorated a Church devastated by the Reformation. His less well-known contemporary, Turibius of Mogrovejo, was God’s “saintly surprise” in the New World. Spanish-born lawyer, professor, head of the feared Inquisition, Turibius was still a layman when a grateful king appointed him Archbishop of far-off Lima. Once in Peru, however, Turibius was appalled at the abuse of indigenous peoples by the occupying conquistadores—his fellow countrymen—and by the complicity of the clergy. He became the natives’ devoted advocate, building churches, schools, hospitals, and the first seminary in the Americas, publishing catechisms and prayerbooks in the native languages he painstakingly mastered. Four hundred years later, whenever Pope Benedict welcomed Latin American bishops to Rome, he always invoked “the shining example of San Toribio.”

**SANTO TORIBIO DE MOGROVEJO
(1538-1606) - 23 de marzo**

Toribio nació en Mallorca, España y desde muy joven mostró un interés y conocimiento notable del derecho civil llegando a ser profesor de Derecho en Salamanca y juez inquisitorio. Siendo laico recibió el nombramiento de Arzobispo de Lima, por pedido del rey Felipe II al Papa Gregorio XIII. Llegó a Lima, Perú en 1581 y quedó sorprendido al ser testigo de los abusos de los conquistadores y la poca atención del clero hacia los pobres, pues se habían puesto del lado de los opresores. Esta situación le conmovió tanto que fue el primero en convocar un concilio de obispos en América; como fruto del mismo concilio se logró la impresión de catechismos y libros de texto en el idioma vernáculo, promoviendo además, una renovación en la vida de los sacerdotes. Visitó todas las comunidades de su diócesis en tres ocasiones, sufriendo los embates del clima, el hambre y la falta de mapas. Además de fundar hospitales y el primer seminario de América, fue quien trajo justicia y paz al Nuevo Mundo. Se le honra como el santo patrono de los obispos latinoamericanos.

CELEBRATING SUNDAY FOR CATHOLIC FAMILIES *(Kara O'Malley)*

This weekly guide is intended to help parents engage their children with the Mass and deepen their appreciation of the richness of their faith. The brief reflection on an excerpt of the Gospel is intended to spark your thinking about the Scripture with your family after Mass.

HEARING THE WORD: John 11:17-23 *(excerpt of the Gospel on March 29, Fifth Sunday of Lent)*

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles away. And many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise."

REFLECTING ON THE WORD

ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS

How did Martha express faith in Jesus? How can you trust Jesus in the same way?

If possible, go with your children to a loved one's gravesite. Share memories. Read John 11:17-44 aloud. Discuss how Mary and Martha and their friends must have felt when Lazarus died. How do you think they reacted when he walked out of the tomb? How would you react if you were there? What does this story tell us about God? Pray for all of the dead, that they might rise to new life like Lazarus did.

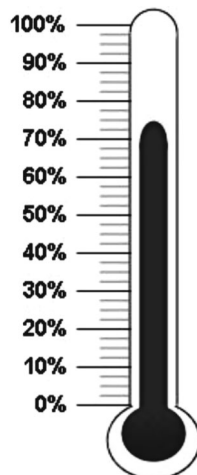

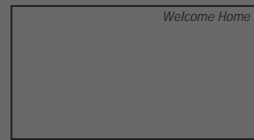
