THE SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY

TIME - It is very easy to see the connection between today's first reading from Sirach and the Gospel reading from Matthew. The first reading is taken from the Book of Sirach, which is also known by two other names – The Wisdom of Jesus Ben Sira (Sirach is the Greek form of this name) and Ecclesiasticus (Latin for Church Book). The St. Charles Borromeo Bible Study on Picayune, MS, explains why it was called the “Church Book” – “It received this name from the fact that, after the Psalms, it was the book most used in the liturgy; in fact, in the early Church it was a kind of official catechism used in the catechumenate”. The Book of Sirach was written in Hebrew sometime after 200 BC and translated into Greek around 132 BC and is part of the Deutero-canonical Books of the Bible or Second Canon. These books are only recognized by the Catholic Church. This book is also unique in that it is the only biblical book that identifies its author. Sirach was a wise sage and priest who lived in Jerusalem and who was steeped in the law and in the prophets. This particular reading from chapter 15 is part of Sirach's dissertation on free will. Sirach explains that one cannot blame God for sin in the world. That is because all of us have a free will to do what we want. This is the clearest explanation of free will in the entire Old Testament. God gave us the Law (commandments) to the people to help guide us away from sin and to do good. As Sirach says – “If you choose you can keep the commandments, they will save you”. However, we do have free will. Sirach concludes by stating – “No one does he command to act unjustly, to none does he give license to sin”. This ties into today's Gospel reading. Today's Gospel reading from Matthew is a continuation of Matthew's dissertation on the Beatitudes (chapters 5-7). In this reading, Jesus is telling the people that He has “come not to abolish but to fulfill” the Law. Jesus continues by saying – “Amen, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or the smallest part of a letter will pass from the law, until all things have taken place”. Jesus is saying that the law must be observed to the letter “until heaven and earth pass away” and “until all things have taken place”, which means His death and resurrection and the advent of the New Covenant. However, that does not mean that the Law goes away. No, as evidenced by Jesus' enhanced teachings on anger, adultery, divorce, and oaths. These are the teachings that all of us must follow to become closer to Jesus.

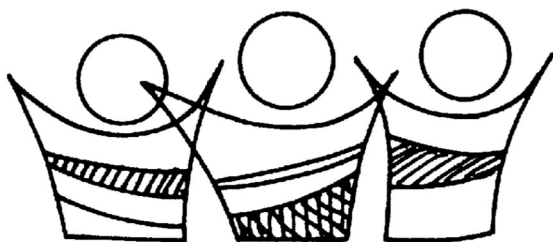

INFORMACIÓN SOBRE EL NUEVO CORONAVIRUS

As part of the emergency declaration, which went into effect Sunday, February 2, 2020, all travelers returning to the United States, who have been in China's Hubei province (where Wuhan City is located) within 14 days, will face a mandatory quarantine and be monitored by county public health officials.

All travelers returning to the United States from other parts of China will face enhanced screening upon reentry to the country and are asked to voluntarily self-quarantine at home at up to 14 days to ensure they do not pose a health risk.

In either case, if anyone becomes symptomatic within 14 days since their last day in China with fever (including chills or night sweats), cough, or shortness of breath, they should call a healthcare provider immediately and let them know their travel history and symptoms.

Please note, there are precautions to keep the virus from spreading. There is no evidence to suggest that novel coronavirus is circulating in Santa Clara County at this point.

What Can I Do to Prevent a Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) Infection?

The same simple steps that prevent the spread of ordinary flu viruses work against 2019-nCoV and other illnesses.

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
- Cough into a tissue or your elbow (not your hand). Then throw the tissue away and wash your hands.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick
- Keep students at home if their temperature is above 100.0 F (38.7 C) or they report not feeling well, appear weak or ill. Consult your health care provider if you or your child has special health conditions that put you at increased risk

Students should not be excluded from parish or any religious education activities due to race or country of origin.

The Public Health Department has a webpage dedicated to novel coronavirus in English, Chinese, Spanish, and Vietnamese at <http://sccphd.org/coronavirus>, which is being updated regularly.

We will continue to closely monitor this situation, which is evolving as expert health agencies learn more about the novel coronavirus. As we have updates, information, and resources from the County Public Health Department or other agencies, we will provide them to our community.

We deeply appreciate everyone's efforts in staying informed, calm, and thoughtful as we all do our part to help keep our communities safe. Let us keep all who are affected by this virus in our prayers.

Como parte de la declaración de emergencia, que tomó vigencia el domingo, 2 de febrero de 2020, todos los viajeros que regresen a los Estados Unidos, que hayan estado en la provincia china de Hubei (donde se encuentra Ciudad Wuhan) dentro de 14 días, enfrentarán una cuarentena obligatoria y serán monitoreados por los funcionarios de salud pública del condado.

Todos los viajeros que regresen a los Estados Unidos desde otras partes de China se enfrentarán a una evaluación al reingresar al país, y se les pedirá que se sometan voluntariamente a una cuarentena autoimpuesta en sus hogares hasta 14 días, para asegurarse de que no representan un riesgo para la salud.

En cualquier caso, si alguien se vuelve sintomático dentro de los 14 días desde su último día en China con fiebre (incluidos escalofríos o sudores nocturnos), tos, o dificultad para respirar, debe llamar a un proveedor de atención médica de inmediato y hacerle saber su historial de viaje y sus síntomas.

Tengan en cuenta que existen precauciones para evitar la propagación del virus. No hay evidencia que sugiera que el nuevo coronavirus esté circulando en el Condado de Santa Clara en este momento.

¿Qué puedo hacer para prevenir una nueva infección por el nuevo coronavirus (2019-nCoV)?

Los mismos pasos simples que evitan la propagación de los virus de la gripe común funcionan contra el nuevo coronavirus y otras enfermedades.

- Lávese las manos con frecuencia con agua y jabón durante al menos 20 segundos. Use un desinfectante para manos a base de alcohol si no hay agua y jabón disponibles.
- Tosa en un pañuelo desechable o en su codo (no en la mano). Eche el pañuelo a la basura después de toser, y lávese las manos.
- Evite tocarse los ojos, la nariz, o la boca con las manos sin lavar.
- Evite el contacto con personas enfermas.
- Quédese en casa cuando esté enfermo.
- Mantenga a los estudiantes en casa si su temperatura es superior a 100.7 F (38.7 C) o si informan que no se sienten bien, o parecen débiles o enfermos. Consulte a su proveedor de atención médica si usted o su hijo tiene condiciones especiales de salud que lo ponen en mayor riesgo.

Los estudiantes no deben ser excluidos de sus clases o de cualquier actividad parroquial debido a su raza o país de origen.

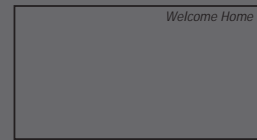
